

Entries are now open online at https://portal.motorsport.org.au/octozy/login

FOR THOSE WHO ARE NEW to Motorsport Australia events, we recommend that you look through what you need in advance so anything that needs to be done is taken care of before the event. For more details on licencing or the Online Event Entry system, contact the Event Secretary Benn Gregory.

This event is always a great way to start the motorsport year, with a low-key friendly weekend of try, testing, tuning, competition and catching up with old friends and perhaps creating some new friendships. All types of cars are welcome to the event, but with a limited number of spaces you need to get your entry in early to secure a place and if needed, book your accommodation.

Only have 1 day available that weekend? No problem, you can enter just Saturday (TTT) or just Sunday (Super Sprint), or both.

When entering, YOU MUST SELECT ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

Activity 1 (Saturday TTT) or

Activity 2 (Sunday Sprint) or

Activity 3 (BOTH DAYS to get the discounted price).

EVENT SCHEDULE

Friday 16 February - General Practice conducted by WDSCC (Pay on the day direct to Morgan Park Raceway) **NO ENTRY TO THE PRECINCT OF MORGAN PARK RACEWAY PRIOR TO FRIDAY 16th FEBRUARY.**

Saturday 17 February - TTT (TRY, TRAIN, TEST)

Starts with a COMPULSORY 8:15am drivers briefing.

It is envisaged there will be 7 groups and 4 sessions of approximately 15 minutes each.

Testing / Practice (Entries will decide the break-up)

Training (2 people in car, both must hold a MA licence, trainer approved by the Clerk of the Course)

Canteen is open on Saturday and Sunday.

Camping available only to entrants (Contact Morgan Park Raceway. Cost is \$10 per site with electricity.)

Sign on and Scrutineering will commence on Friday from 2.00pm and then Saturday from 7:00am.

Transponders for Sunday Sprints and Race Numbers are available from Tower Saturday afternoon, time to be confirmed over the PA.

Sunday 18 February - SUPER SPRINTS/REGULARITY/RACING

Starts with a COMPULSORY 8.00am drivers briefing.

Groups will be determined by the numbers and type of entries.

Sign-on and Scrutineering will commence from 7.00am.

First group on the track at 8.15am after the completion of the drivers briefing.

It is envisaged that each group will get 4 sprints for the day.

Regularity Group:

The 1st event to be used as a sighting run.

The next 3 events count for overall points. You must finish all 3 events to win.

It is envisaged there will be 1 sighting and 3 runs. If less, then points will be awarded accordingly.

If a 5th event is held it will not count towards points.

Supplementary Regulations are attached and should be reviewed prior to entering this event.

Groups for Saturday and Sunday will be posted on HRCC website https://hrcc.org.au/news/ with any further details.

MyLaps is the timing system for Sunday Sprints. **A \$100 deposit** is required for all MyLaps transponders, the deposit is refundable on return of the Transponder.

You will be issued with a Race Number when picking up the transponder.

Carport hire is booked through the Online Event Entry system along with your entry.

Entries close Sunday 4th February 2024. Late entries should first contact the Event Secretary.

There will be NO fuel available at the circuit.

ENSURING SAFETY – NEW SELF-EXTRACTION REQUIREMENTS IN 2024 & 2025

Wednesday 06 December, 2023



All Motorsport Australia licenced competitors will be required to self-extract from their vehicles in 10 seconds or less from 2025 and beyond, with a 15 second limit in 2024.

In line with advice from the Motorsport Australia Risk and Safety Committee, and FIA standards, the phased introduction will provide competitors with the opportunity to practice the best way to self-extract themselves from their vehicles before being tested at events.

In 2024, competitors will initially be required to self-extract in 15 seconds as part of a staged introduction of the new requirement, before the 10 second limit is mandated on 1 January 2025.

This requirement will not apply to those competitors competing in categories that already have a shorter extraction time listed in their regulations, with the lesser time taking precedence.

Motorsport Australia has implemented the requirement to ensure competitors are trained and ready if they are required to self-extricate during an emergency situation.

A number of tests were conducted at events across disciplines in 2023, with competitors tested averaging well below the 10 second requirement.

Motorsport Australia Director of Motorsport & Commercial Operations Michael Smith said the new requirements would not be overly onerous, based on the test results across the sport.

"Together with input and technical analysis conducted by our Motorsport Risk & Safety Committee, this change provides competitors with clear requirements around self-extraction with an initial 15-second limit in 2024, before transition to 10 seconds in 2025," Smith explained.

"The ability to self-extract from a vehicle is an important part of motorsport safety in line with international guidelines being used around the world. This is important as in the event of a serious incident time is crucial. The tests conducted at events around Australia this year saw competitors average well below 10 seconds, highlighting that for most competitors this will not be a significant challenge. For example, at a state circuit racing event where competitors were tested this year, the average time of self-extraction was 8.45 seconds, and the slowest time recorded was 11 seconds.

"Like anything, the more practice competitors get at self-extraction, the better they will become. This is also something people can practice at home or at the workshop without adding any additional testing costs, as you simply need to belt yourself in wearing your full race gear and practice the best way to exit your vehicle.

"When it comes to fire and other leaks or issues, a quick self-extraction is key to surviving and minimising or preventing serious injury. Practicing self-extraction will provide some muscle memory and improved reaction times that you can rely on should you ever find yourself in an emergency situation.

"Our officials and staff will be very happy to work with those who may not initially be able to meet this goal to ensure they can understand how to meet the requirement and self-extraction requirements."
