The meeting was not without some small challenges leading into practice on Friday and early on the Saturday but many thanks to everyone working together to overcome these hiccups.

John Miller delivered his first event as Secretary and with magnificent support from Paul Clemens managed to get through to Sunday without a heart attack. John and the team will be better for the experience as will the HRCC team so thank you John for taking the step up.

Thanks also to Graeme Hodges and his band of helpers for delivering an effective Friday Practice as always and the forever reliable John Tupicoff and Jim Goulden for picking up the pieces to make sure we all experienced a wonderful event.

Often overlooked are the efforts of the Treasurer when it comes to all the up-front work prior to, through and after these race meetings so please reach out to Morne Lombard when you see him next and say thank you for doing an excellent job. Morne has also been working very hard with me this year to modernise the club banking and accounting system and I'm happy to report this is greatly assisting to simplify that area of the clubs' operations.

Chris Fung has also been very active in the Facebook and related areas of the club and the visibility attached to the online profile this provides. Lisa Catchpole (Editor of this Newsletter amongst many other things) and Chris are working closely to align our messaging with results certainly showing good engagement.

Sadly, the decision had to be made not to proceed with the Shannons Motorsport Festival due to extreme low entry numbers from all corners. Factual information on what led to the decision is listed shortform here to assist members understand why.

Total entrants peaked at 60 with 3 weeks to go before event close.

Increase in track hire costs are making it extremely difficult to provide more affordable events with our open door costs for this meeting approaching \$85k - this directly affects entry costs.

Super Mini Challenge disappointingly, did not inform anyone within the HRCC they had made a decision on the Sunday of Autumn Historics to withdraw from the commitment they made to attend all HRCC Meetings in 2024. We only learned of this after a call was made to

ask when they were entering.The bulk of the Inter Club Challenge member clubs did not enter citing the QR venue and entry costs (which were reduced in line with what they do pay based on track time & inclusions). The big exception was the MX5 club which supported at a very high level with 17

- Part of the early pre-event conversation did include direct discussion with the Porsche Club. Their original indications of providing 30 - 60 entries turned into zero and this due to them already going to the QR a couple of times in 2024 and not wanting to go again.
- Our own membership only contributing 25 entries of the 60 in total.
- Other external feedback on reasons why the event is not popular heavily weight the QR race track being boring and / or hard on cars and not promoting good racing, track location which affects the off track socialising in a negative fashion, accommodation choices, time of year due to people heading overseas for European holidays etc, car readiness, health concerns, ability to pass MA medicals and new compliance requirements with exiting vehicles etc.

Ultimately the club will need to consider what the future looks like for the number, location and timing of events. The time consumed by the committee and various external volunteers like Benn Gregory to put an event together only to get no support is a huge disappointment. This is especially frustrating when we all receive requests or questions why the club is not doing more events for members.

Our next event is the HISTORIC QUEENSLAND at Morgan Park on October 18th to 20th so put it in on your calendar as we would like this to be a big one.



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Autumn Historics - Morgan Park A Lotus Perspective

This article is broadly based on an article by Peter Svensson which appeared in the June edition of "Lotus Notes".



Over the weekend of 27 & 28 April the weather on Queensland's Southern Downs was perfect for classic sports car action – mild, dry and clear. Over 135 historic competition cars had assembled at the attractive and challenging Morgan Park racing circuit on Warwick's outskirts. The HRCCQ's annual Autumn Historics program, including practice and qualifying sessions, ran to 37 events: six regularities, five super sprints and twenty-six races. Something for everyone and plenty of track time.

It might be expected that such a recipe would, amongst others, attract a goodly number of production-based sports cars. One expected to see at least a few Alfa Romeos, Austin-Healeys, clubmans (of various marques), Lotus, MGs, Triumphs and, perhaps, a sprinkling of early Porsches. We know they are out there, so where were they?

From a sports car enthusiast's point of view, sadly there was a distinct lack of production-based sports cars altogether; a mere fifteen or so in an entry field dominated mainly by touring cars. While not devaluing the importance of historic racing, sports-racing and touring cars, the absence of healthy numbers of Group S and "invited" production-based sports cars was somewhat depressing. Indeed, given that Morgan Park's "K" circuit represents one of the best and safest venues for sports cars to be driven in the classic tradition, the very low numbers of such cars remain a mystery.

However, as a Lotus *aficionado*, it was particularly disappointing to this writer that just three Lotus entrants turned up to represent one of the twentieth century's most innovative and successful racing marques.

Bruce Melville made the trip from NSW to make his Morgan Park debut in a 1967 Lotus Elan S3, Peter Boel brought along his (controversially rebodied) 1968 Lotus 23 (the "Flintstone") and Peter Svensson shared his 1967 Lotus Elan with support technician, Scott Kelly.

Of the three cars, Peter Boel's Lotus 23 was a constant front-runner over the four races for the Historic Sports & Racing Group. Bruce Melville's Elan has an interesting history, having been imported from California just a couple of years ago after a racing career and thorough rebuild in the USA. Originally consigned from the factory to Bermuda, it had the advantage of being built as a right-hand drive version, although Bruce only uses the car for competition outings rather than road work.

Peter Svensson drove his 26R-bodied Elan in the regularity events while Scott Kelly tackled the more competitive super sprints as the sole sports car. Confounding pre-race scepticism about the performance of the diminutive Elan, Scott set very quick times against tin-top competition to the astonishment of commentators and spectators alike.

While both Peter Boel and Bruce Melville hardly laid a spanner on their cars throughout the weekend, the Svensson Elan had dramas first thing on Saturday morning.

Peter returned to the pits on his first lap trailing a plume of smoke and the Elan spent the next three hours in the pits as Scott, with a number of nearby Weber "experts", attempted to resolve carburetor problems. It was pit bay neighbor, Patrick Townshend from NSW (1960 Austin Healey 3000) who scoured the paddock and found the pair of new copper floats which enabled the Elan to resume competition.

Because the Elan had missed practice, it began behind all the twenty-odd regularity competitors at the rolling start. As a result, Peter had to work his way past several cars before catching up with Bruce's Elan. Thereafter, the two Lotus cars kept very close company, passing and repassing each other as they diced with other 1600 class cars. As Bruce said at the end of the weekend: "At least we demonstrated that Lotus cars can still put on a good show".

It is strongly recommended that historic and classic sports car owners give the HRCCQ events at Morgan Park a try. The three competition levels of regularities, super sprints and races provide a good range of events for our cars. The organization was professionally run, incidents were minimal, the support of fellow enthusiasts heartening and the sporting comradeship unsurpassed.

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

1965 RAMBLER CLASSIC 660 CROSS COUNTRY WAGON

Built at AMI Port Melbourne, one of only 185 in 1965, this American/Australian beauty was discovered, unrestored, in Adelaide in 2009 and driven home to Brisbane by the current owner.

In 2010, all rust was removed and a full body structural restoration was completed by Pebble Beach award winning Sleeping Beauties, Brisbane.

A stunning duotone refinish resulted in a white turret overlaying a lower body in blue whilst internally the original red trim offsets the AMC tri-colour presentation. Over the years mechanical overhauls have returned this wagon to a high level of on-highway cruising ability.

In 2021/2 a complete engine overhaul was completed by Mark and Garry Hammond of Capalaba and the car was last displayed at the RACQ Motor Fest in June 2023.

Personalised plates, subject to state laws, are included in the sale.

Originally considered as an historic tow vehicle for a 1968 AMC AMX 390 the complete combo is also available with a tandem trailer to suit.


Thereafter David Malone competed the car until, in early 2014, keen Holden man David Streat purchased the GTR and it again became a regular Group N entrant at Lakeside, and especially Morgan Park. David currently competes another XU-I and so in August 2023 John Carson took over ownership.

Meanwhile this one-careful-lady-owner 2012 Mitsubishi Challenger LS Diesel automatic has done under 177,000 kilometers, features dealer fitted towbar plus electric brakes and has never been off-road or on the beach.

Unfortunately, due to a December 2023 skiing accident in Canada John is now having to give up motorsport and the Torana, a PBL 2490 kg ATM trailer and the Mitsubishi Challenger are now available for purchase. The PBL ATM 2490 kg tandem trailer is fitted with a 12,500 lb electric winch.
