This impacted TTT numbers, which were lower than usual. That's fine – it's just the way it worked out. Some members and other punters simply opted for other events instead of the club's TTT practice weekend.

So.... HRCC's 3 official racing weekends are now on the horizon. Keep an eye on our FB page/website, read the newsletter and reach out to club reps for updates.

Race weekend #1 - HRCC Autumn Classic Speedfest - Morgan Park May 9th-11th The event flyer is *attached*.

This was previously called the Autumn Historics. The name change is just that- it is still HRCC's big Autumn meeting.

The MSA entry portal will open in the next week or so. We await approval of the Supplementary Regulations from MSA. As soon as they are processed, the portal will be opened.

Please note: For our 3 race weekends this year, we have removed the early bird entry discount.

Instead we have increased the HRCC Member discount to a substantial \$70 per event.

Just a reminder we are trialling Saturday night socials at the track in 2025. For the Autumn meeting, we will kick off as soon as racing finishes, around 4:30pm in the pits. This year, we've hired a local Warwick Musician, Luke Costello and his band, to entertain us. We think his laid-back style is well suited.

If you are camping, you won't have far to walk home!

There will be food and drinks for purchase. For the budget conscious amongst us, you won't need to drive to Warwick for dinner.

Let's all support this initiative and enjoy an evening under the stars with family and friends.

Practice Day - HRCC member only practice day - 5th June 1-5pm - Qld Raceway

We have scheduled this 1 month prior to the big July race meeting. This is a member only practice afternoon.

We plan to run on the tracks being used for CLASSIC QLD. We encourage you to take this opportunity for track time.

Entry will be on the day, so just roll up to QR and pay when you get there. We'll send reminders closer to the date.

Once again, if you support this other initiative we can make it a regular annual event on our calendar.

Race Weekend 2 - CLASSIC QLD - Qld Raceway, Willowbank - Jul 4th-6th

The event flyer is attached.

There will be a fair contingent of interstate entries, so let's make them feel welcome.

The Saturday night party will be held on the rooftop area at QR. This will be a catered food and beverage event. We will ask you to confirm attendance as we get closer to the event.

Accommodation used to be a challenge for QR events.

However, did everyone know that good camping is now available at QR? Alternatively, Springfield Lakes is around 18 minutes drive from the track and offers numerous 3-5 star accommodation options.

This July meeting has a number of interesting facets to it.

- GROUP N will be running a full grid at each of our 3 race meetings this year.
- F5000s At this stage they advise that between 15 and 25 of their cars will attend.
- Off Track Display/concours on Sunday 6th This is being managed by Bill Westerman, supported by John Carson and others. The display will include race cars, classic cars and motorcycles.
- The Historic Motorcycle Club (HMCCQ) are joining us for CLASSIC QLD. Did you know they have around 1700 QLD members! Their management committee expect at least 60 bikes at our event, which will really add some spice to the weekend.
- We've spoken to a select number of car clubs about joining the display. Interest from some clubs is strong.

The HRCCQ pass on their condolences to Neville's family and friends.



High tensile bolts are used in applications where durability is critical to firmly and safely hold components together.

A common example would be in an automotive system, where high tensile bolts:

Hold together the linkages of the suspension system; or 1.

2. Attach the brake calipers to the knuckles

Getting this right is important for obvious reasons: safety, reliability and the longevity of components.

This excerpt from Champion Parts might point you in the right direction. **Disclaimer:** AIMS is not an expert in fastener design, therefore the information provided herein should not be treated as professional advice. The official source is cited.


Read the head markings

The markings on the head face of a bolt can be confusing. How do we specify the grades between each pattern and make sure you get the correct size?

1. Check if there are any head markings. They will indicate if the bolt is metric or imperial and the grade/class.

- 2. Look at the threaded part of the bolt/setscrew and identify if it is a fine thread or coarse thread. Using a vernier, measure the diameter of the threaded part of the bolt/setscrew, as shown in Fig. 1.
- 3. Use a pitch gauge to determine the pitch of the thread, as shown in Fig. 2.
- 4. Using a ruler, measure the length of the fastener from under the head, as shown in Fig. 3.



Corrosion protection

A popular option to avoid corrosion is zinc plating, where a metal bond is formed between the steel and the zinc, which serves as a protective layer. Zinc-plated fasteners are ideally used in dry environments. Otherwise, stainless steel fasteners may be a better option.



Colour

The colour of the fastener is determined by a pigment additive during the electroplating process. That is why some fasteners appear to be gold (yellow-ish) or silver (clear) in colour. They do it just to enhance the appearance of the fastener. It does not have anything to do with durability.



HISTORIC FORMULA VEE

Vb Eligibility Date Extension

Please note that Motorsport Australia has updated the 2025 Historic Vehicle Eligibility document "4.03-Sports and Racing: F, J, K, L, M, O, P, Q, R, T, V and F5000".

The group is intended to cater for Formula Vee racing cars with a competition history established in the period between 1 January 1975 and 31 December 1985 and has now been extended to 31 December 1991.

GROUP VB

FORMULA VEE RACING CARS: 1975-198691

The classification of vehicles within this group will be at the absolute discretion of Motorsport Australia.

The group is intended to cater for Formula Vee racing cars with a competition history established in the period between 1 January 1975 and 31 December 198691.

Consideration may also given to the classification within this group of vehicles constructed between 1 January 1975 and 31 December 198591 but with a competition history established subsequent to 31 December 198591, or in some cases without a competition history, provided that:

- the specification of the vehicle is consistent with the Formula Vee rules and general standard of technology in vehicles raced during the group period, and
- (b) the vehicle is compatible in appearance with such vehicles.

WELSOR WAGGOTT GROUP Q CLUBMAN

Built by Welsor (Colin Wear) in 1972 this car was very successful in state championships in the hands of Welsor works driver David Seldon.

It was the first Welsor to feature a beam front axle with radius arms and Watts linkage that provides extremely good handling and enables very late braking plus simplicity in front wheel alignment and camber adjustment.

To quote Colin Wear "with the beam axle there's no camber change under braking so the full width of the tyre can apply the braking forces".

Rear suspension comprises trailing arms and BMC diff with fully floating axles and both front and rear suspensions feature adjustable coil-over AVO springs and shock absorbers.

Disc brakes all round with 8" front and 10" rear rims fitted with near new Avon slicks.

It is powered by a Corolla 3K engine (1298 cc, twin 45 DCOE Webers, dry sump, electronic ignition, etc with Carillo pistons and Spool conrods) and a close ratio 4-speed Corolla gearbox with Modena gears and shafts.

I have owned the car since 2003 and used it mainly in historic racing and the Morgan Park sprints and it is in very good condition.

It is realistically priced to sell at \$29,500 ono and comes complete with C of D and a good assortment of spares including spare blocks and 3K big port cylinder heads.

The car is housed in Brisbane.

Built at AMI Port Melbourne, one of only 185 in 1965, this American/Australian beauty was discovered, unrestored, in Adelaide in 2009 and driven home to Brisbane by the current owner.

In 2010, all rust was removed and a full body structural restoration was completed by Pebble Beach award winning Sleeping Beauties, Brisbane.

A stunning duotone refinish resulted in a white turret overlaying a lower body in blue whilst internally the original red trim offsets the AMC tricolour red, white & blue presentation.

Over the years mechanical overhauls have returned this wagon to a high level of on-highway cruising ability and it features a tow bar.

In 2021/2 a complete engine overhaul was completed by Mark and Garry Hammond of Capalaba and the car was last displayed at Caboolture Aerodrome & the Tambourine Classic Car Shows of mid 2024.
